

GRAND TRAVERSE COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION

ADOPT-A-ROAD

Individual Application and Permit

For Use of County Road Right-of Way

All types of roadways may be adopted including two lane, boulevards, and business routes. Permits will be issued to the group for a two (2) year period. Groups wishing to continue pickup after the 2 year period are required to update their application. Assignments will be made on a first come/first serve basis. Groups agree to pick up litter a minimum of three (3) times a year during designated dates in April, July, and September. The actual pickup dates will correspond with Michigan Department of Transportation dates. Participants are required to adopt, at a minimum, a two-mile section of road (both sides). Less than two-mile sections may be adopted with Road Commission approval, but identification of group/organization may not be provided.

A permit is required to be placed on file at the Road commission office to participate in the Adopt-A-Road program. No permit fee shall be charged. A minimum of information is required to complete this form. A performance bond and proof of insurance are not required to complete this permit.

PERMIT CONDITIONS

This Permit issued subject to the following conditions:

1. This permit grants to the permitted only those rights specifically stated and no other.
2. Issuance of this permit does not relieve permitted from meeting any and all requirements of law, or of other public bodies or agencies.
3. Any operations in the county road right-of-way not covered by permit and the appropriate Road Commission specifications are in violation of the jurisdictional authority of the Road Commission with respect to the control of the county road right-of-way unless approved by the County Road Right-of-way permit Agent. Any change or alteration in the permit activities requires prior approval of the road commission and may require a new permit.
4. The permittee shall be responsible for the cost of restoration of the Road commission facilities and right-of-way determined by the commission to be damaged as result of the activities of the permittee.
5. The permittee shall save harmless the County Road commission, Board of county road Commissioners, and employees thereof against any and all claims for damages arising from operations covered by this permit.
6. This permit is not assignable and not transferable unless specifically agreed to by the Road commission.
7. The permittee, upon request of the Road commission, shall immediately cease operations and surrender this permit.
8. Participants must hold a safety meeting once a year prior to the first pickup, conducted by the adopting group. All participants must sign a form acknowledging the training. Forms shall be kept on file at the road Commission office.
9. All participants must wear an orange or hunter's orange vest while working in the right-of-way. The Road Commission will supply safety vests. The adopting group may keep vest in their possession while completing their minimal two year commitment, when route is surrendered the vest are to be returned to the Grand Traverse County Road Commission. The group shall replace any vest at it's own expense which are lots or not returned.
10. Group participants must be a minimum of sixteen (16) years old unless otherwise approved.
11. All trash must be placed in bags provided. Those objects too large/heavy shall be placed next to bags. Full bags are to be placed in designated locations for pickup. No bags or larger objects shall be piled on the shoulders.
12. The Road Commission will provide, install and maintain signs, noting the program and participants. These will be located near the beginning point from each direction. Groups wanting more signs will not be allowed to pay for additional signs.
13. Groups must consists of least six people and three backups, all identified by name, address and phone to participate in the Adopt-A-Road program. Group contact person must be identified.
14. Groups failing to follow the guidelines or not participating in the trash pickups for two periods of the year will have their permit revoked and the sign designation removed. The first pick up date missed will be followed by a warning, the second occurrence will result in the groups permit being revoked. That particular section of right-a-way will then be available fro another group to adopt. The Road commission will retain the right to revoke any permit at any time.
15. All vehicles shall be parked well off the right-hand shoulder so as not to obstruct traffic and in accordance with posted restrictions.
16. Groups must notify the road Commission if they intend to drop the program.
